Junior Leadership kicks off with a reception at the Chamber with the participants, Directors of the Chamber, Leadership Lake Norman Alumni, and various elected municipal officials. This is followed by a one day retreat combining team building and diversity training. The program continues for six months in one day sessions.

Area leaders are in business, government, media, education, health care, and tourism, enlighten the participants about the resources, infrastructure, and facilities available to Lake Norman citizens. During each session the group will look at topics ranging from crime to law and community infrastructures.





## **Application and Criteria**

#### Attendance Policy:

Junior Leadership Lake Norman participants must attend the retreat and graduation. ONLY one absence is allowed. Participants must attend at least four of five full-day sessions. Please mark program dates in your calendar and inform school staff. These attendance requirements ensure a valuable experience.

#### Dress Code and time:

Casual dress is recommended at all sessions with the exception of graduation. Typical day runs from 8 am to 2 pm with some sessions ending at 1:30 pm.

#### <u>Tuition</u>:

Tuition is \$140, an investment in future civic and leadership opportunities to graduate and earn a certificate.

#### Selection & Applications:

The program accepts 21 participants, selected based on leadership potential and community involvement. Applications are due by September 26 at 5:00 pm and must be emailed to **Russell@lakenormanchamber.org**
